Virtual work experience placements for under-represented students

Challenge

As businesses look at improving diversity and inclusivity in the workplace attention has also turned to students and what organisations can do to improve and support their journey from education to career. The challenges of the past few years has meant that many have missed out on work experience or insight days and the impact even greater for students from deprived areas or those who are disadvantaged through lack of networks.





Deliverable

SSCL is committed to contributing into communities and supporting a wide range of charities by using its expertise – the skills of its people.

By partnering with its parent company Sopra Steria and social mobility charity Speakers for Schools, SSCL was able to offer a new experience.

Speakers for Schools is a charity aiming to end educational inequality by giving all students access to the same networks available to the top fee-paying schools in the UK.

Through a collaboration with SSCL a programme of virtual work experience placements was designed to students from across the UK!

SSCL's virtual work experience focuses on the Future of Work. Guest speakers from across SSCL share their insights on a range of topics – including CV and interview techniques, innovation and creativity, and project management. Students are given the opportunity to use the insights from these sessions to develop their soft skills by completing a project tackling a genuine business problem. Using online whiteboards facilitated by our workshop experts, students work together in groups to explore potential opportunities related to the Future of Work and brainstorm solutions.

Students demonstrate the value created by their solutions with desk-based research and present their findings back to a panel of senior managers from SSCL and its key clients - gaining additional experience with handling questions and receiving feedback.

Throughout the virtual work experience, students are supported by SSCL volunteers acting as mentors to help them develop their presentations and reflect on the work experience.

The first session was held over one week with 17 students taking part from across the UK with more held in 2023 in collaboration with Ministry of Justice.







Results

Offering virtual work experience placements give underrepresented students valuable opportunities to learn from industry professionals and gives them the chance to apply their newfound knowledge and practical skills to tackle genuine business challenges. It empowers students to unlock their potential and gives them the chance to have a real impact on the future of work in SSCL.
